In addition to our Annual Gathering in Charlotte and our second pilarimage to Montgomery, we hosted a 10-part web series, Continuing the Conversation, building upon the theme of decolonizing the Great Commission, six **Prophetic Imagination** webinars, a Black History Month Teach-In, and our annual Juneteenth Vigil. We also collaborated with JPI (Justice for Palestine and Israel) and **BPFNA** to host webinars on divestment and boycott as tactics for social change and the food insecurity

crisis in Cuba.

There have been moments over the last few years, where we have collectively wondered if this path we're on is the one where God is leading or if we had, instead, wandered off course. And yet, we find ourselves having received not simply more funding than we needed to cover our expenses in 2024, but for the first time since 2021, we received

more funding than the previous year! Your support reversed a three-year trend of declining revenue that had resulted in cuts to our budget—from staff positions to program opportunities to travel. While finances and fundraising are not the indicator that proves we're on the path on which God continues to lead us, the reality of our financial position entering 2025 provides hope and a push to keep going—to keep following this path on which God is leading us.
